## CHECKLIST OF REQUIRED FRESHMAN COURSES FOR BUSINESS STUDENTS:

The following is a checklist of requirements for the *freshman* year. We recommend taking these courses your FIRST semester. You can delay enrollment until the second semester if they are unavailable or there is a time conflict with other classes or if noted with other options.

Please make a note and be sure to inform your NSE adviser of any advanced placement or college-level course work already completed in these areas.

Students admitted to the J. D. Edwards program complete a specialized program of courses and should work closely with the program's advisers in the selection of first semester classes.

 **MATH, 3-5 cr**

Math 107, 107H, 108H, 109H, 208, or 208H – see course descriptions

Be sure to notify your adviser at NSE if you have advanced placement credit.


Honors students, you may enroll in 'H' (honors) sections, if available.

Actuarial Science majors **MUST** take 106 or higher—not 104.

Your score on the Math Placement Test (tested in high school or you will be at NSE) will determine appropriate placement. At a **MINIMUM**, Math 104 or higher is required, but you may need to take one or more of the following prerequisite classes based on your placement results.

Math 100A, 3 cr, Intermediate Algebra

Math 101, 3 cr, College Algebra

 **ENGL 101 or 150 or 151, 3 cr**

Take one either your FIRST semester or SECOND semester

Honors students, you may enroll in 'H' (honors) sections. Be sure to notify your adviser at NSE if you have advanced placement credit.

**CHECKLIST OF GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES FOR BUSINESS STUDENTS:**

In addition to the requirements above, *all* business students are required to complete courses in each of the following general education areas some time over the next four years. Most students will complete these hours during the freshman and sophomore year.

Prior to your NSE day, please review these classes and check (✓) a minimum of two (or more) in EACH general education area that interest you. Your NSE adviser will assist you in finalizing your schedule with the appropriate number of credit hours for your first semester. Make sure to review the course descriptions before selecting a course.

Some of these classes may not be available until the spring semester; others may conflict with required courses. It is in your best interest to review and identify a number of interesting classes prior to your NSE day. You may also use the
